This reality makes the call to love others online more urgent than ever.


COUNTERING THE NEGATIVITY

- love where others attack


Loving others is a simple concept.

Likewise, Jesus' call to love our neighbors is about inviting others into positive connections. We extend empathy instead of nursing grudges.

6 WAYS TO PUT YOUR LOVE INTO ACTION ONLINE

- Or do you pause before responding with patience?


If you're like most people, you react fast. Because online, we often move at breakneck speeds, often responding without thinking and quickly moving on.

But this doesn't set you up very well for building connections and offering God's love to others, does it?

Here are 6 helpful tips to help you slow down, put love into action, and connect meaningfully with others in digital spaces.

1. PRAY

Before you scroll, take a moment to ask God to show you His love and compassion for the individuals you'll encounter. Pray for wisdom to control your words, and ask the Lord to open your eyes to see opportunities to bring light and life into digital spaces.



2. PAUSE

In this fast-paced digital world, practice patience by pausing before you respond to someone. Taking a deep breath can create space for you to hear God's voice before you act and to consider how you can bring grace and love into an interaction.

3. SEEK INDIVIDUALS

Jesus addressed the crowds, but He often offered love and guidance one on one. Prioritize individual interactions instead of public platforms. And when you do speak up in shared digital spaces, keep in mind that you won't always know who your audience is, so it's important to lead with compassion and generosity.

4. ASK QUESTIONS

Jesus often asked open-ended questions, inviting people into a place of connection and listening. Asking questions also breaks down defensiveness – because all people want to be understood. Encourage dialogue, connection, and curiosity with thoughtful questions and active listening.

5. SHOW HOSPITALITY

Even in digital spaces, you can practice hospitality. Work to create safe spaces where people feel warmth and welcome. Just as you would to a guest in your home, give others the benefit of the doubt and assume the best in them. Respond to others with kindness and help them feel valued, even when they leave hurtful comments.


6. EXTEND GRACE

Start with prayer, then hop online and put these tips into practice to help you engage in ways that build connection and show God's love to your digital neighbors.




YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE
